#### **NEW STERILIZER MACHINE**

April 2021

The Foundation was pleased to be able to support better patient care through the purchase of a new low temperature hydrogen peroxide sterilizer.

The system is intended for use in the sterilization of medical devices and equipment in healthcare facilities using vaporized hydrogen peroxide.

The previous low temperature sterilizer was approximately 17 years old. When it broke down, the MDR staff required a Biomedical Technician



from the Northern Zone to come and do the repairs. In the meantime, they would have to ship St.
Martha's medical devices and equipment to another hospital for sterilization which can cause delays or cancellations of procedures.

## REHABILITATION UNIT UPGRADES

The Foundation was pleased to work with our donors to provide \$50,000 in support of new equipment for the rehabilitation unit at St. Martha's. Upgrades included a new upright bike and stair set to name a few. The bike is a key component to the exercise protocols as ordered by surgeons in the recovery of most orthopedic surgical repairs, such as knee replacements and ACL repairs. The bike helps to regain lower extremity range of motion, strength and improve cardiovascular health. It is a perfect addition to our gym in providing the best service in general conditioning programs and sport rehab at St Martha's. The stairs have two different grades, which allows patients to practice and regain strength prior to heading home. These are just two of many new pieces supporting improved patient care at St. Martha's!

## MUSIC THERAPY IN PALLIATIVE CARE



January 2022

When the Foundation was asked to support a pilot project that would bring music therapy to patients of the palliative care unit, we jumped at the opportunity. We asked Rebecca, the music therapist contracted to provide music therapy in the unit to tell you a little bit about what she does at the hospital and what she loves most about it:

"Much of my work in palliative care would be considered "receptive methods" meaning that the patient receives the music without actively participating in the music making. This can be beneficial for relaxation and promoting reminiscence when using patient preferred music. Depending on the patient, some participate in the music-making through singing, playing handheld percussion instruments, tapping their hands and feet, etc." - Rebecca MacDonald, MTA

"Music therapy is such a rewarding field to be a part of. It is amazing to see patients respond to music and have such positive experiences in sessions. In the work that I do, individuals may be receiving difficult news and processing complex emotions related to their prognosis, autonomy, and dignity. It is amazing to witness how relaxed individuals become during music therapy, as well as being able to learn about the life and memories of wonderful patients." - Rebecca McDonald, MTA
